South Trent River Nature Hike (hiking)

A lovely spring hike with the sounds of Orange-crowned Warblers & Rufous Hummingbirds all around.

The first 9 k was fairly brisk to the marsh viewing stand where we had a leisurely lunch & listened to Common Yellowthroat warblers around the marsh.

The birding increased as we saw Song Sparrows, Canada Goose, male & female Northern Harrier, Turkey Vultures, heard Pacific Wren, heard a Northern Flicker drumming on the metal Hydro pylons, and saw a female Rufous Hummingbird gathering nesting material from the pussy willows along the Hydro right-of-way.

The woods along the river were full of trilliums & Calypso (fairyslipper) orchids (including some white ones) Other blooms included Salmonberry, Red-flowering Currant, Pacific Bleeding-heart, yellow Stream Violet, Palmate Coltsfoot.

Total distance 15 km , took us 4.5 hrs with a 1 hr lunch break.

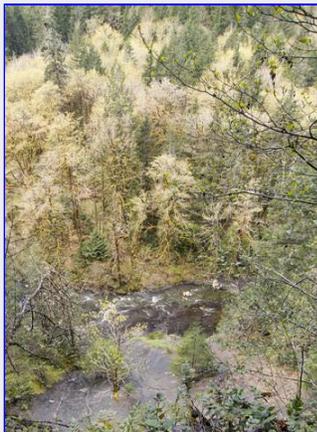
