

This morning five other snowshoers, in two groups, left ahead of us. Two of them we met again on the summit whilst the other three must have turned back at some point. Brian Ross and a friend arrived as we were packing up to head down. We stopped and chatted for awhile and then they promptly took off to head down. For us, it was a good job that stayed a bit longer as the fog cleared and we had all the views that we wanted.

The snow was quite a bit softer on our return trip and made for some fun coming down in the steep sections. We saw no signs of any avalanches in any of the the areas that we were in and none were visible on the other viewable steep hill sides. The trail had been well used over the weekend. We did hear some noisy snowmobiles from time to time, but we didnt actually see any until we were out of the park on the way back. Lots of kids and toboggans at the bottom of the hill.


